When reporting anti-social behaviour

When reporting anti-social behaviour it is helpful if you can describe what happened, where, when, how often, who was involved and how you and other people are being affected by it.

A lot of things, like teenagers meeting in groups or children playing in the street, are not necessarily anti-social behaviour.

But problems that happen frequently over a long period of time and cause you alarm, distress or harassment could be.

Even though this kind of behaviour may upset you and your neighbours too, you may not want to bother the police about it.

But, by letting the police or your council know what's happening you can help them take action and stop problems like this becoming more serious.

We're making it easier for you to report behaviour which may spoil your quality of life so it's easier for you to get help with the things that matter to you.

How to report anti-social behaviour

Anti-social behaviour covers a wide range of issues so the organisation you report it to will depend on the problem and the people involved.

We've grouped potential problems into the following areas to make it easier for you to get in touch with the right person:

Call Derbyshire police on 101 about:

- Criminal damage
- Verbal or physical abuse
- People causing a nuisance or being rowdy in public places
- Street drinking, underage drinking or being drunk in public
- Nuisance motorbikes
- Harassment, or individual incidents due to race, sexual orientation, gender, religion, disability, gender identity or age.

In an emergency always dial **999**

To give anonymous information about a crime or anti-social behaviour call Crimestoppers on **0800 555 111**

Call your district or borough council about:

- Noise nuisance
- Disputes with your neighbour
- Environmental issues, including fly tipping, graffiti, abandoned vehicles, dog fouling, litter, fly posting and discarded needles.
